



You Could Be Eligible for Free Home Repairs

Are you eligible?

- Live in Oklahoma County
- Meet the low or very low Adjusted Median Income (AMI) requirements as defined by Housing and Urban Development (HUD)
- Be the owner of the home at least one year prior to assistance
- Be the intended occupant of the home subsequent to the repairs being completed.



Through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Housing Preservation Grant, Rebuilding Together Oklahoma City will provide homeowner assistance to very low and low Income homeowners in the Spencer and/or Nicoma Park areas of rural Oklahoma County.

Such assistance will be used to reduce the cost of repair and rehabilitation, to remove or correct health or safety hazards, to comply with applicable development standards or codes, or to make needed repairs to improve the general living conditions of the residents, including improved accessibility by persons with a disability.
